f. The main concepts related to the mainstreaming of the rights-based approach and its implications in the management of development initiatives.



OVERALL OBJECTIVE

Train professionals from different disciplines interested in understanding the particularities of the system, instruments and mechanisms for international development cooperation, trained to work, under a critical view, in the field of public administration, companies, academic institutions and third sector; managing the different stages of the cycle of programs and development projects in their most common fields of development, to propose solutions to the problems of society in general and the Honduran in particular.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

1. Provide criteria for the analysis of the political, economic and social factors that cause inequality and the causes of underdevelopment from a global perspective with attention to the different sectorial approaches.

2. Know the actors that make up the international development cooperation system, as well as the instruments, tools and mechanisms most used in this area.

3. Deepen the use of technical and conceptual tools for the critical analysis and development of south-south cooperation and triangular cooperation processes (between two or more developing countries, supported financially by a donor from the north, an international organization or even by

another development partner).

4. Develop skills for the management of the cycle of programs, plans and cooperation projects and the formulation of development and teaching policies in these areas.

5. Know the political and economic situation of the groups of countries and commercial blocks, as well as explore the operation of international organizations, the general structure of diplomatic missions, cooperation and development agencies, as well as non-governmental organizations.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

a) University degree given or recognized in UNAH and collated photocopy in any of the following areas: Social Sciences, Economic Sciences, Engineering and related Areas.

b) Have obtained an average of or greater than 70% in undergraduate studies.

c) Management of the Internet and Microsoft Office.

d) Complete resume and letter of interest.

e) English language proficiency a reading comprehension level.

f) Attendance at an interview.

g) Approval of mandatory preparation courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS
